MEMORANDUM

I have received the report of Computer Forensics, Inc. Unfortunately, the search of the hard disk did not yield the document for which Computer Forensics was directed to search. Under my earlier order, Computer Forensics was not to share its report with any one but me. I now believe that it is appropriate to share the report and its attachments with counsel for the parties. Fairness requires, however, that, before I authorize the release to plaintiffs' counsel, the defendant examine for itself the report and the attached files which Computer Forensics found on the computer and printed. I will therefore ask defendants' counsel to visit my chambers and examine these materials and to indicate whether defendants have any objection to the release of the report and the attachments to plaintiffs' counsel subject to any existing protective order. If

there are objections I will resolve them. If not, I will make the same materials available to plaintiffs' counsel. Ultimately, we will have to proceed to the question of whether any further searches of the hard disk are feasible and worthwhile.
