

JURY SCAM

Citizens are being targeted by a juror phishing email that requests them to complete and provide personal identification information (SSN, DOB, mother's maiden name, etc.,) on an attached PDF form.

Courts using eJuror or AppearWeb will never request citizens to provide personal identification information directly in an email response. Courts require prospective jurors to complete qualification questionnaires by formal written correspondence or provided instructions for the juror participant to be authenticated over a secure connection.

All citizens should report such emails to their local courts.

Sample Letter

Dear Prospective Juror 0150,

It is the policy of the United States that all litigants in Federal courts entitled to trial by jury shall have the right to grand and petit juries selected at random from a fair cross section of the community in the district or division wherein the court convenes. It is further the policy of the United States that all citizens shall have the opportunity to be considered for service on grand and petit juries in the district courts of the United States, and shall have an obligation to serve as jurors when summoned for that purpose.

As an American citizen, it is your civic duty to respond to a jury Summons and, if chosen, to serve as a juror. You have officially been invited so.
