NOTICE TO THE CLASS OF PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR AN AWARD OF ATTORNEYS' FEES AND EXPENSES

Pursuant to Rule 23(h)(1) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, notice is hereby given to the members of the Plaintiff class in the above-captioned matter that, on May 30, 2025, the attorneys representing the Plaintiff class in this case filed Plaintiffs' Motion for Attorneys' Fees and Expenses [Dkt. No. 525], requesting an award of attorneys' fees and expenses totaling \$22,689,060.25. If the motion is granted, the fees and expenses will be paid by the District of Columbia. Class members may review Plaintiffs' motion and file with the Court any objections that they may have.

Determining if you are a class member. The Plaintiff class includes people with physical disabilities who have received D.C. Medicaid-funded long-term care services in a nursing facility for 90 or more consecutive days, are eligible for Medicaid covered home and community-based long-term care services that would enable them to live in the community, and would prefer to live in the community instead of a nursing facility but need the District of

Columbia to provide transition assistance to facilitate their access to long-term care services in the community.
