IN RE: REINSTATEMENT OF MASK REQUIREMENT FOR ALL INDIVIDUALS IN PUBLIC AND NON-PUBLIC AREAS OF COURTHOUSE Standing Order No. 21-45 (BAH)

## <u>ORDER</u>

On July 27, 2021, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued updated public health recommendations for fully vaccinated individuals in light of the increased circulation of the Delta variant of the coronavirus within the United States. *Interim Public Health Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People*, CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION (last updated July 28, 2021). The CDC added a recommendation that fully vaccinated individuals wear a mask in public indoor settings in areas with "substantial or high transmission." *Id.* The CDC noted that "some infections do occur among fully vaccinated people" and that "[f]ully vaccinated people who do become infected with the Delta variant can transmit it to others," concluding that "fully vaccinated people can further reduce their risk of becoming infected with the Delta variant and transmitting it to others by wearing a mask in public indoor settings in areas of substantial or high community transmission." *Id.* 

Currently, the rate of transmission in the District of Columbia is considered "substantial." On July 29, 2021, District of Columbia Mayor Muriel Bowser reimposed an indoor mask mandate for all persons, regardless of vaccination status, effective July 31, 2021.<sup>3</sup>

Accordingly, in light of current circumstances, it is hereby

**ORDERED**, effective July 30, 2021, that

1. All individuals, regardless of vaccination status, are required to wear a face mask, which must

completely cover the nose and mouth, at all times while in the public and non-public areas of

the E. Barrett Prettyman United States Courthouse and the William B. Bryant Annex (the

"Courthouse");

2. A Judge may permit staff and visitors to remove their masks while within the Judge's

chambers. A presiding Judge may permit a participant in a court proceeding to remove a mask

while in the courtroom.

3. Paragraph 5 of In Re: Updated Access Restrictions and Masking Protocols During the

COVID-19 Pandemic, Standing Order No. 21-42 (BAH) (July 15, 2021), which permitted fully

vaccinated individuals to remove their masks in non-public areas of the Courthouse, is

superseded; and it is further

**ORDERED** that this general mask mandate for public and non-public areas of the Courthouse

will remain in place until further order of the Court.

SO ORDERED.
