Public and Media Advisory

Please be advised of the following arrangements for public and media access to the proceeding scheduled in *United States v. Trump*, 23-CR-257 (TSC), at 10:00 am on Thursday, September 5, 2024.

The three public entrances to the E. Barrett Prettyman Courthouse and the William B. Bryant Annex (“Courthouse”) will be open to the public and media by 7:30 am. Please note that the Constitution Avenue entrance closes at 9:00 am.

Media Access to Proceeding:

- Two media rooms will be open, with approximately 100 seats for members of the media. A media room pass is required for entry. See <https://www.dcd.uscourts.gov/media-information>.
- Seats in the media rooms will be first-come, first-served and may be limited to two per organization.
- Media organizations that have at least one reporter with a long-term media room pass are guaranteed at least one media room seat.
- To check in for a seat in a media room, members of the media should report to conference room 1131B on the first floor of the E. Barrett Prettyman Courthouse, beginning at 8:00 am.
- Approximately 20 seats will be available for members of the media in the courtroom where the proceeding will take place. Members of the media interested in a seat in the live courtroom should advise court staff in conference room 1131B upon arrival. Courtroom seats will be assigned in an equitable manner (e.g., pool, lottery, first-come, first-served) depending on the level of interest.

Public Access to Proceeding:

- An overflow courtroom will be open for members of the public to observe a live audio/video feed of the proceeding. Approximately 75 seats will be available in the overflow courtroom, and seating will be first-come, first-served.
- Approximately 20 seats will be available for members of the public in the courtroom where the proceeding will take place.
- Signs will be posted by 8:00 am near the central elevator banks on the first floor of the Courthouse with information about the locations of the overflow and live courtrooms and where public lines should form.

All electronic devices must be powered off and stowed away while in the overflow or live courtroom. Anyone violating this prohibition will be required to leave the courtroom immediately.
